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National Leadership and Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Grant Programs

The Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) is now accepting FY 2019 proposals for <u>National Leadership Grants for</u> <u>Libraries (NLG-L)</u> and <u>Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian</u> <u>Program (LB21)</u>.

New this year, IMLS is offering one application deadline for the two programs, which have previously each had two cycles per year. Applicants have through **Monday**, **September 17**, to submit their two-page preliminary proposals.

The NLG-L program invests in projects that address challenges faced by the library and archives fields and generate results such as new tools, research findings, or models that can be widely used. The LB21 program supports professional development and training projects for libraries and archives.

ALSC Changes Name of Laura Ingalls Wilder Award

AL: The Scoop, June 25 The ALSC board voted 12-0 to change the name of the Laura Ingalls Wilder Award to the Children's Literature Legacy Award on June 23 during the 2018 ALA Annual Conference in New Orleans. In a joint statement released by ALA and ALSC on June 25, Wilder's works are acknowledged to "reflect dated cultural attitudes toward Indigenous people and people of color that contradict modern acceptance, celebration, and understanding of diverse communities."





